Valuable resources for women removed.

They're saying out loud what was true from the beginning. Those in favour of abortion don't want it for the exceptions, they want it to be the only option for women who are uncertain about their pregnancy. A recent <u>CBC News article</u> has resulted in the removal of valuable resources for expectant mothers in the Chatham-Kent area. The CK public health unit used to have Refuge, a local pregnancy care centre, on its list of community resources. This organization provides women with support during and after pregnancy through counselling, classes, baby clothes, food, and other items. Refuge's website says, "If you are experiencing an unexpected pregnancy and need support as you navigate your options, we can help. We offer evidence-based information on all of your options (Abortion, Adoption & Parenting) to help you make an informed decision." But, because abortion activists thought it "outrageous" and "unacceptable" that women could possibly be offered this kind of well-rounded support, Refuge is no longer listed as a resource for women in Chatham-Kent. What could possibly be wrong with providing hope and support to women that want to have their babies? Keeping women from accessing help and hope from community resources is outrageous and unacceptable.
